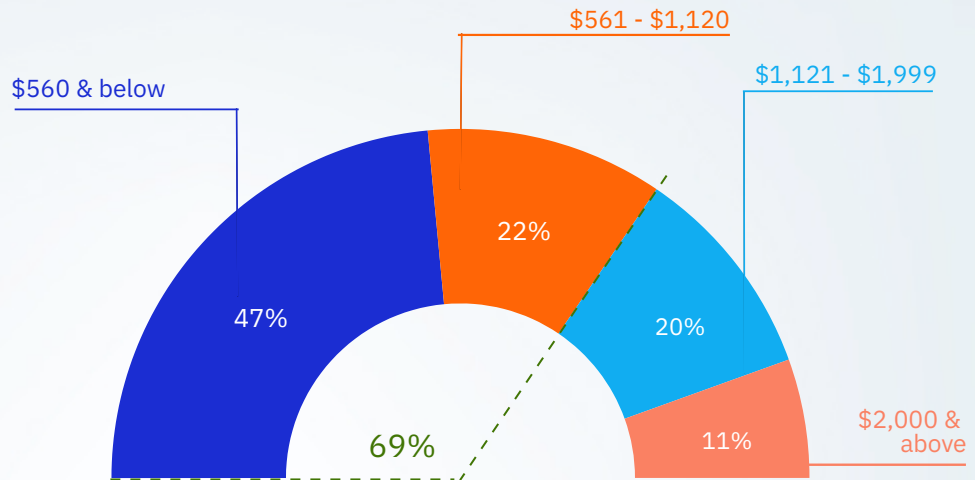

Based on application data

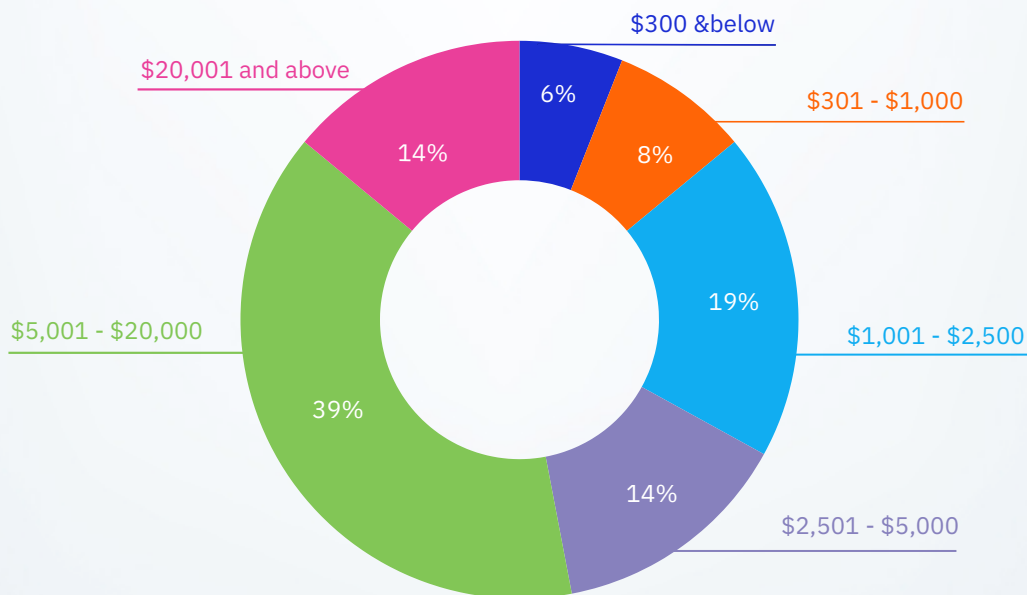
69% of applications come from the **lowest 20% PCI** of our community, measured by Department of Statistics (Household Income), 2021.

Mdm Enah suffers from Atrial Septal Defect (ASD)* with pulmonary hypertension, requiring long-term medication to manage her critical oxygen saturation levels.

She is unable to secure employment and her family subsists mainly on her husband's income as a cleaner. Despite Enah's daughter's efforts to supplement the household income through her part-time hairdressing job, the family still struggles to make ends meet as Enah's husband also incurs high expenses for his medical follow-up.

With the support from donors, Enah received the necessary medication. She is now able to manage simple tasks like going to the market and is on her way to recovery.

**ASD is a congenital heart condition where there is a hole in the wall between the two upper chambers of the heart. Due to the size of the defect, this causes blood to flow into the lungs excessively, leading to heart enlargement and pulmonary hypertension (elevated blood pressure in pulmonary arteries).*
